Thalassaemia is the number one genetic disorder in India and is very common here in Eastern part of India, especially in West Bengal. There are so many families who are suffering social problems also here – such as distance from their relatives and neighbours and especially the carrier females are rejected by their male partners to marry. In so many cases fathers of the affected child were not cared by his/her father and mother alone is bearing the treatment. The most interesting aspect of this is that it is preventable. However, in our country, prevention effort has not succeeded so far due to lack of community engagement which results from lack of awareness.
